Titus 2:11-15(ESV):

11) For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, 12) training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, 13) waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, 14) who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works. 15) Declare these things; exhort and rebuke with all authority, "Let no one disregard you."

Titus 2:11-15(KJ):

11) For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men. 12) Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; 13) Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; 14) Who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto Himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works. 15) These things speak, and exhort, and rebuke with all authority. Let no man despise thee.

Titus 2:11-15(Amplified):

11) For the grace of God-His unmerited favor and blessing-has come forward (appeared) for the deliverance from sin and the eternal salvation for all mankind. 12) It has trained us to reject and renounce all ungodliness (irreligion) and worldly (passionate) desires, to live discreet (temperate, self-controlled), upright, devout (spiritually-whole) lives in this present world, 13) Awaiting and looking for the (fulfillment, the realization of our) blessed hope, even the glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Christ Jesus, the Messiah, the Anointed One,14) Who gave Himself on our behalf that He might redeem us (purchase our freedom) from all iniquity and purify for Himself a people-to be peculiarly His own- (people who are) eager and enthusiastic about (living a life that is good and filled with) beneficial deeds. 15) Tell (them all) these things. Urge (advise, encourage, warn) and rebuke with full authority. Let no one despise or disregard or think little of you-conduct yourself and your teaching so as to command respect.
